Ringing for HRH Prince Philip

Over 2,500 performances have been lined to the memory of HRH. Mostly this was single bell tolling. Towers right across the Guild were involved in ringing on the day of his death, the following day and on the day of his funeral.. Two QPs of minimus were rung at Potterhanworth and one at St Mary le Wigford at this time. A full peal was rung at St Mary le Wigford in 5 minimus methods (Chris Woodcock ringing 2 bells), it was the 20th peal on the bells. A QP was rung on RR of Kemerton and Badgeworth Bob on the day of the funeral.

Ringing Room:

There was little to report from Ringing Room until the end of the month when there was a late flurry. A QP of Yorkshire Major was a 1st of surprise for Alyson Blanchard. Then on 29th of the month, three QPs were scored: 2 Minor (Primrose and Norwich) and Cambridge S, which were rung on the 25th anniversary of the massacre in Tasmania, remembering the 35 people killed. A further QP of Superlative Major was rung which was a first in method for Jo French, Jane McKee and Alyson Blanchard.

Practices using RR still abound, the Butterwick team rang for the 60th birthday of fellow ringer, Bruce Talmage. Two new people have been introduced to the Cast of 1000 initiative this month – Jane McKee and Jo French. They have both had a very successful first session which bodes well for the future. The Guild now has at least eight members participating which is helping to put Lincolnshire on the map.

News from the branches:

Eastern: Many congratulations to Caitlyn Meyer on becoming a grandmother. Welcome to Sebastian Meyer, a son for Ben (ex Alford ringer) and wife Jemma.
