A 3rd QP at Grantham (Grandsire Caters) welcomed Elinor, new daughter for Emma and Matthew Jones and granddaughter of Martin Jones, all rang in the QP.

It's great to see so many first Q Pealers :Congrats to Archie Randall Williams who rang his 1st QP, the treble to PB Minor at Market Deeping, and to Thomas White who rang his 1st at Silk Willoughby (treble to 2 doubles m). The latter celebrated the marriage of Alan and Sylvia Bird and remembered Richard Short who had rung at Silk Willoughby for many years. A QP was rung at Folkingham in memory of Sir David Amess MP.

4 peals were rung at Sproxtton: one of 6 minor methods, 3 were new methods: Land of Green Ginger Alliance, Holme on Spalding Moor Delight and Buachaille Etive Mor Delight. The latter was in memory of George Deas who completed the Scottish Monroes by climbing this mountain.

West Lindsey:

The branch meeting at Epworth was well attended and enjoyed by those present. QPs were scored at Scotter (Cambridge Minor)and Bottesford (PBD) as ringers are getting back into full swing. The handbell peal at Lea was rung in single figure temperatures outdoors.

Elloe Branch:

The QP of PB Triples at Fulney was a 1st on 8 for Paul Doades. It was the 1st on 8 bells at the tower after many years of being in an unringable state and thanks were given to the benefactors for their donations to make ringing possible again. A peal was then rung on the bells of Yorkshire Major, it was the first peal on the bells since 2008 and was the first on 8 for Luke Tobin. A QP was rung at Long Sutton of Turramurra S. and was a 1st in method for John Bennett and Luke Tobin. Luke also rang his 1st of London Minor at Gosberton. At Gedney a QP of 7 doubles methods was in memory of Sir David Amess MP.
