#### **Lincoln Cathedral – Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> August**

*From Frank Kennington, Ringing Master, Northern Branch of the Lincoln Diocesan Guild of Church Bellringers:*

Several members of the Branch and also the Master of the Cathedral Company of Ringers have expressed their disquiet and hurt at comments expressed in the recent newsletter of a neighbouring ringing society. These comments passed the writer's derisory opinion of the ringing by branch members at Lincoln Cathedral on the afternoon of Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> August 2007.

We are invited by the Cathedral Ringers every year to ring the bells on a Sunday afternoon in August. This very much treasured invitation gives **ALL** our members the opportunity to ring at Lincoln Cathedral. It gives everyone the opportunity to say: "I have rung at Lincoln Cathedral" – this is something I, personally, am very proud to be able to say and I am sure that others feel the same as I. Everyone from ringers who can only attempt to ring rounds to those who can cope with Maximus are all

made very welcome by the Cathedral ringers. They accept that our performance is not going to be up to their standards but they make no distinction between "learners" and "experts".

I know, from personal experience, that this opportunity to ring at our magnificent Cathedral means so much to those who turn up regularly at their own churches for Sunday Services throughout the branch.

Ringing at the Cathedral on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> August 2007 ranged from rounds to Surprise Royal, Cinques and Maximus – I thus ensured that everyone present on the afternoon had a ring. Considering most of the company who were there on the day do not ring twelve bells on a regular, or even irregular, basis, I feel that we did not disgrace the Branch. **Branch Striking Competition – 14<sup>th</sup> June at Grasby**

With help from the Branch, this event was re-arranged for a night that all possible teams could enter, although we know there are a few more of you who could put teams together, so come on for next year!!! Considering the competitive element of the occasion, all teams socialised together to make the evening enjoyable.

Unfortunately, I've misplaced the comments and results but will publish them as soon as they become

available. Thanks to David Hibbert and the team at Grasby for being the perfect hosts, keeping everyone topped up with drink and cake, and to Chris Turner, the judge, and his glamorous assistant, none other than the Guild Master, Sue Faull.

### **Ridgman Trophy – June 16<sup>th</sup> at Rothwell, Northants.**

This is a regional competition for the eastern guilds of England, in which the LDG has taken part for a number of years. On this occasion, one member of our branch was in the team, namely Matthew Jeffery, where the set piece was a touch of Stedman Caters. The standard of ringing here was very high, and out of the ten teams who entered, Lincoln came fifth with 22½ faults. So well done to Matt and the rest of the LDG team.

### **Open Gardens – 17<sup>th</sup> June at Claxby**

This was a busy weekend for some, but those who did make it not only had a good ring, but they also got to take in the hospitality of the village and the lovely gardens. If you didn't make it this year, you missed something special, because if you have not been before, the village is in a lovely setting. I'm sure those who went this year will be going again next year. Those who didn't go should be sure to put the date in your diary when it becomes known.

### **Guild Committee Meeting report**

For a newsletter at this time of year, you would not find a Guild Committee Meeting report, as the meetings have been in February and March. To allow some issues to be discussed in more detail, we had an extra meeting in June. We all enjoyed a slow drive to the location via the Waddington Airfield traffic. The first item on the agenda was changed to not having future meetings clashing with the Waddington air show!

The Striking Competition rules were revised and the new rules are shown below.

The aim of the Competition is to encourage towers to improve the standard of their striking, particularly for Sunday Service ringing.

#### *Rules:*

- 1. All ringers must be members of the Guild. No-one shall ring for more than one tower.*
- 2. No tower shall enter a team containing fewer than four persons who ring for Sunday Services at that tower.*
- 3. The contest shall be on six bells and shall consist of 240 changes, either of minor or*

*doubles with a cover. Where the band is unable to ring methods, they may ring call changes. No allowance is made for intricacy of method.*

- 4. For methods, exactly 240 changes shall be rung. Teams ringing fewer, or more, than 240, shall be deemed to have rung out and will not be counted in the placing.*
- 5. For call changes, the first row away from rounds will be taken to be the start. The first 240 rows will be marked. Within these 240 rows, 4 different bells must be brought to lead. The changes of lead should be distributed across the whole test piece.*
- 6. A period of three minutes will be allowed to enable the band to get the feel of the bells. The bells must then be stood. As a signal to the judge, a few strokes shall be rung on the treble immediately before the commencement of ringing the test piece.*
- 7. The conductor may stop and re-start the attempt once, providing no more than thirty changes or half a minute of call changes have been rung. The band will stand and the treble rung again as a signal of a restart. A penalty of 10% of their faults shall be added on to make their final mark.*
- 8. A clock will be provided in the ringing chamber for the use of contestants.*
- 9. A steward will be available to assist, if requested, with the timing of the practice and may be asked to advise the band of the completion of the test piece.*

*The judge's decision is final.*

The committee looked at the child protection policy and it was suggested that really Branches and towers should revisit the policy and insure everything possible was being carried out. Should anybody need a copy of this, they should contact Lorraine.

Those of you who have seen the Womble simulator will have seen the promotional banners next to it. These cost £150 each and the Guild has suggested it may be a good idea for each Branch to purchase at least one to help them when holding events when bellringing can be promoted and, hopefully, new ringers found. So this is one to get your views together for the next AGM in January.

The six-bell simulator was at Lincoln Cathedral for two weeks for a special event where many of the C of E schools in the Lincoln Diocese go along to carry out activities. For next year's event, we need to encourage many of our C of E schools to put the

simulator down as one of their activities, in the hope that the children may be interested in going to their local tower to learn to ring, so long as the bells are ringable! If any of you have the contact details for your local C of E school, you can pass them onto Lorraine, and at around Christmas time the Guild will distribute letters to ask the schools if they will choose the simulator.

Good news for those of you who are over (I think it was) 75, as people up to the age of 85 are now insured under the Guild liability insurance.

### **LDG Christmas cards**

Branch members were kept very busy over the two days introducing the art of bellringing to young children through to senior citizens!

The two days were blessed with lovely weather. Our thanks are extended to Dorothy Robinson for her foresight in enabling us to borrow the belfry.

Whilst the amount of funds raised is not yet available, at the service at the end of Sunday's show

the Vicar of Market Rasen extended his sincere thanks to all the bellringers who helped out over the two days.

Being able to use the belfry in this way proved a very enjoyable exercise for all the ringers involved and it was lovely to meet so many old friends working together for such a worthy cause. F.K
