It was rung in memory of 2 Lincolnshire characters – Bill Holmes and Roger Bailey. Another peal at Sproxton of Wissington was 100th together for lan Robinson and Alan Bird. A QP of PBM at Billingbrough was 1st Major inside for Robert Ingamells and it was nice to see a family member from "Down Under" ringing. Feb Branch Practice was moved at the last minute from Long Bennington to Saltby and was well attended with many ringing for the first time on 10,. Ringing included Little Bob Royal, Stedman Caters, Plain Hunt Caters and a first class lower of 10 in peal.

West Lindsey Branch: Very sadly the branch members learned that John Smith, former ringer at Scotter, and Peter Rushton former ringer at Upton have died. Our thoughts are with their families at this sad time.

A QP of PBD was rung at Belton in memory of Malcolm Sargeant, a keen branch ringer. His granddaughter Ellie rang in the tribute. Many congratulations go to Carol Parker who rang her 1st peal at Messingham. It was rung on the same bell, to the same method (PBM) on the same date as her mother rang her 1st peal 70 years previously. It's doubtful that this has ever been done before. A QP of PBD at Stow was a 1st QP for Jerry Parker (tenor) and 1st inside for Nolan Runciman.

Elloe Deaneries Branch: A QP of Kemerton Bob Minor at Whaplode was a 1st in method for all the band. QP of Grandsire D was a 1st in m inside for Robert Ingamells. The Singles/Minimus group were busy: new methods Hark the Herald Angels, Wyberton, Grainthorpe, Harrington and N. Somercotes TP Singles were rung and named in QPs. Allexton, and St Valentines TP Minimus were rung to QPs and named. A peal of Allexton TP Minimus was rung at Allexton, Leics and was the 1st peal on the bells. A QP of 11m/1p was a 1st as cond of dobles for Luke Tobin.

Central Branch The QP of PBT at Harmston was a 1st on 8 for Chris Rainthorpe and 1st in m for Tristan Shaw. A peal of Yorkshire was rung at Washingborough to mark the 25th anniversary of the 1st peal following rehanging and for the 5th wedding anniversary of Ben and Jemma Meyer.
