The funeral took place of the Very Rev Oliver Twisleton Wykeham Fiennes at the Cathedral. Oliver was Dean of the Cathedral, and President of the Guild from 1969 – 1989. A number of peals and quarters were rung around the Guild in thanksgiving for his life.
