Irnham ringers rang a sponsored QP for Children in Need, it was a 1st in method for all but the conductor, they also rang a QP in remembrance of the 1st village resident to be killed in WW1. A QP was rung at Grantham for the Christmas Tree festival where there was a skating rink set up inside the church – surely a 1st. The branch practice at Deeping St James attracted about 25, and there was a halfway break from the ringing for tea/coffee and mince pies as well as a short meeting when the 2016 programme was agreed.
