Central: The Branch are very sorry to announce the death of John R Ketteringham, MBE, peacefully at home on Christmas Eve, aged 86. John was an Honorary Life Member of the Guild, and author of Lincolnshire Bells and Bellfounders. Watch the Guild website for funeral arrangements. QPs have been rung at North Scarle, Elsham, Newton, Stainby and Caythorpe and peals at Stow, Dunston, Blankneyand Market Deeping in his memory. Sincere condolences to Joan and family. A QP of Stedman Cinques for the installation of the Bishop of Grantham, Right Rev. Nicholas Chamberlain, was a 1st for Michael Lawton, and 1st as cond on 12 for Jeremy Wheeldon. 12 QPs were rung at St Mary le Wigford during the Lincoln Christmas Market.

Elloe: The funeral of stalwart member of the branch, Ted Brown was held just prior to Christmas and QPs in fond memory were rung at Stoke Rochford, Gedney and Fleet. He will be much missed by branch members.
