Luke is the 5th consecutive generation of ringers. QPs were rung at Potterhanworth, Nocton and Branston, and a peal at Branston to welcome their new vicar following a 9 year interregnum. Congratulations to Sister Maureen Pike on her 1st QP on an inside bell and to Ellie Maude on her most SS Major methods (13) rung in a peal at Kirton in Lindsey.

Southern: The branch are very proud to announce that Tim Carter has been awarded the MBE. In celebration, Tim conducted a QP at Barkston, his 1st Q as cond. A QP was also rung at Silk Willoughby to congratulate Tim. It was a 1st QP for Keith Hildred, who rang the treble to Bob Minor. Very well done to John Macnemeney for his 1st QP (Tenor to PBD) at Stamford All Saints. It was also a 1st QP for Anne Russell for more than 30 years, and for Helen Macnemeney for more than 40 years. The Branch ran a well supported Striking Workshop at Greatford where there was an opportunity to ring with experienced ringers and have a mentor advising one-to-one on listening skills and correcting striking faults.

.3 new methods have been rung to peals and named by Mike Maughan and his bands: Uniform Surprise and Easington Alliance at Sproxton and Scotterthorpe Alliance was rung at Edenham in memory of Marie Atkinson, ringer at Edenham for 60 years. The peal of Heydour Surprise, rung at Longthorpe by Bill Croft's band, was the first in method on handbells. **Eastern:** Rounds were rung at Alford by an all Evans family band, to celebrate the life of Margaret – mother, grandmother and great grandmother. This was the first time they have all rung together. A QP was also rung at Alford in remembrance of Margaret, with some non Evans ringers helping out.
