News from the branches for March:

It was Claire Howard's 1st as cond on 8. Well done to Mary Hartley on her 1st QP inside at Thorpe, and to Janet Crafer for her 1st QP of Bob Minor inside. The Potterhanworth ringers have been busy, the band rang a new method for all the band to a QP - Devon Place Doubles. They also named a new method – Potterhanworth Single Court Doubles by ringing it to a QP. A QP was rung at Martin on the day of the funeral of Brian Buswell, TC at Cotgrave and close friend of Joan Simpson. At the branch practice at Navenby, a number of new ringers were awarded their Level 1 ART certificate.

Southern: Many congratulations to Rob Lee and Lizzy Stokoe on their wedding at Market Deeping. Congratulations to Helena Thorpe on her 1st peal of SS Major (4m) at Sproxton. Well done to Chris Sharp on his 100th peal in hand as conductor which was swiftly followed by his 150th peal in total as cond.
