News from August:

Around the branches:

Elloe Deaneries: 3 peals were rung during the month at Elloe towers to mark the 100th anniversary of the death of local ringers in WW1. At Gosberton, Rifleman Cyril Luesby was remembered, at Surfleet Pte William Flowers was remembered and at Spalding Pte John King, a ringer from Fulney, was remembered by a peal of Fulney Alliance, a first in the method. Central: A peal and a QP were rung at Nocton in memory of local ringer Pte Kenneth Dyke who died on the first day of Passchendaele, aged 19. A peal was rung at Timberland in memory of local ringer Sgt Herbert Ingall. His 2 brothers survived the war and continued as ringers throughout their lives. A peal was rung at Claypole to remember Barbara Clipsham – 21 years after her death. Congratulations to Yvonne Woodcock on her 50th peal – at Martin in Timberland on the 70th anniversary of the 1st peal on the bells. Well done to Tina Wells on her 1st QP of Triples at Sleaford.

West Lindsey: Congratulations to Janet Clarke on her 200th tower bell peal. Branch members enjoyed their ringing at the Cathedral. There was a large number of ringers and non ringing family watching on. All loved the view from the balcony, as the annual Steam Punk festival was in full swing, the Cathedral and castle squares being packed out with strangely dressed revellers.

Northern Branch: There was a good turnout for the branch's turn to ring for Evensong and branch members acquitted themselves well, quite a number never having rung on 12 bells before.

Eastern Branch had their first meeting at West Keal since the completion of work done. The branch acquitted themselves well at the Cathedral, ringing PBM simultaneously on the front and back six, LB Max, Grandsire Cinques – and waved to the crowds below from the balcony. A QP of PBD at Butterwick was a first for Richard Pickwell, a first QP inside for George Pickwell and an 18th birthday compliment for Luke Busby-Smith. A QP conducted by Gemma Evans marked the 10th anniversary of her first. It was also rung in memory of an 8 year old Brownie, a member of Gemma's pack. A QP was rung at Sutterton to mark 25 years as TC of the Kirton in Holland group by Ian Ansell. Congratulations all round.

Southern: Congratulations go to Helena Thorpe who has completed the Standard 8 to peals with London being rung at Sproxton. 2 new methods were named this month – Haltwhistle Surprise and Stocksfield Delight – both rung by Mike Maughan's bands at Sproxton.
