News from May: Guild wide:

Guild Draw An excellent £762 profit was made from the Guild Draw. Thanks to everyone who supported this. **CC meeting** This years meeting was held at Lancaster University, Chris Turner and Philip Green attended. The format of the weekend was different to previous CC weekends- the Sunday afternoon evensong and the Saturday tower grab were abandoned. The much anticipated debate regarding changing all the CC rules (so as to reflect the CRAG proposals that were agreed in Edinburgh last year) went ahead. Calls for a 12 month delay "so the new rules could be improved", were rejected and the original motion was easily passed. The new rules should enable the council to react to situations more speedily. All the old 14 committees have now been replaced by 5 working groups. Anyone, ie not just CC reps, can join these working groups. Only time will tell if suitable volunteers emerge. The triennial nature of council has gone, CC reps can now be changed whenever Guilds want to change them. Our Guild is still entitled to 4 CC reps.
