


LINCOLN DIOCESAN GUILD NEWSCHEET AND DIARY JUNE 2021

Young Ringers: Although this is not a branch or guild organised activity, we are excited to report that following the latest guidance from CCCBR Bell ringing recovery group, a group of young ringers under the age of 18 from the Grantham area have started back to tower bell ringing. The adult supervised youth led practices are helping young ringers regain and build on their confidence in preparation for returning to ringing at their own towers. There is strict adherence to the national guidelines and additional measures have been put in place as a result of local risk assessments. The group is open to all under 18 Lincolnshire ringers who can ring independently in rounds and are within approx 15 miles of Grantham. We think they have all been invited, but if anyone's been missed and is interested, please make our Branch Secretary aware and she will pass on details. Numbers of young people, and adults attending are restricted at the moment, but as restrictions relax, the group is hoping to expand the age range of young ringers involved and to invite additional appropriate adults to support potential new members to integrate into the practice.
