There were 41 attendees via Zoom for the branch AGM. The meeting was opened with prayers and a blessing from the Rev'd Carolyn Bailey. There were no changes of officers and 1 returning member was welcomed. There were positive reactions to Membermojo with the majority of those who have 'logged on' finding the system easy to use. It was agreed that it had been a difficult year due to Covid restrictions however, the branch has seen several successful peal and QP attempts, both in the tower and in ringing room. Moving forward for this year, a program of events has been suggested with plans in place to encourage a return to ringing and also a recruitment drive to encourage new ringers.

West Lindsey Branch: Congratulations to Cindy Potts who rang her 1st QP – treble to PB Doubles at Stow and to Chris Potts for his 1st QP away from Tenor. At the Zoom AGM all officers were thanked for their hard work and re-elected for another year.
