Rings for the 70th anniversary of the Queen's Accession:

35 towers from all around the Guild registered their ringing on Bellboard to mark the platinum anniversary on Feb 6th. Probably many more also took part. Lots more ringing to come in June.

Southern Branch

4 peals in new methods were rung at Sproxton – Cramlington Delight, Pointon Fen Delight (Barry Jones rang his 200th on the bells), Byermoor Alliance (300 together for Mike Maughan and Tony Walker) and Dilston Delight. Well done to all the ringers. A QP was rung at Billingbrough, it was a 1st of Yorkshire on tower bells for Jane McKee, who followed it up fairly shortly with another at Sleaford. A QP was rung at Folkingham in memory of Ian Ansell.

West Lindsey Branch:

A handbell QP of 2 Surprise Minor was rung in memory of Sheila Freeman, wife of Michael and sister in law of John Freeman. The branch held a focused meeting for ringers in the south end of the branch who are trying to master early stages of change ringing. The excellent turnout of helpers meant that good progress was made. It was great to all get together for a meal at the local pub afterwards – first time for 2 years.
