The Branch meeting at Witham on the Hill on 26 March included opportunities for some to ring changes for the first time in a couple of years, and for others to ring up to London S Minor. The Ringing Master overcame audibility problems of conducting wearing a mask by using a voice amplifier to help keep the bells right with good effect. It was good to meet up with some not seen since before the pandemic. It was very pleasant sitting in the sun outside the tower between rings, and afterwards for a drink at The Six Bells.

Two QPs of Cambridge Royal were rung at Grantham, one in solidarity with the people of Ukraine and one to mark the 1302th anniversary of the death of St Wulfram (Covid prevented the 1300th to be marked,) 4 new methods were rung and named in peals at Sproxton – Crawcrook Alliance, Gilsland Delight, Lintzford Alliance, many congratulations to Sylvia Bird – it was her 800th peal and Milestone Alliance which was named because it was Tony Walker's 500th peal and Keith Brown's 900th peal. Very well done to them. A peal of 7 delight methods was rung at Sproxton – a birthday treat for the conductor, Jim Benner. A QP of Kent and Oxford at Folkingham was a birthday compliment to Mark Mumby. It was a busy month in the branch – 2 further QPs were rung – at Irnham and Billingbroough.

West Lindsey Branch:

A peal of PB Major was rung at Stow and was a 1st of major and inside for Alyson Blanchard. Paul Curtis also circled the tower. A QP of Grandsire Triples rung at Gainsborough was a birthday compliment to local ringers Stephen and Janet Clarke. Well done to Suzanne Timmins who rang her 1st QP inside and of minor at Scotter. A peal of 7 surprise minor was rung on handbells, the band enjoying being able to ring al fresco again.

Elloe Deaneries Branch:

At Whaplode a QP was rung for their Civic Service and also a peal of 7 Surprise minor was rung which was a 1st in 7Sm for Luke Tobin. A QP of Kent and Oxford was rung at Fulney in solidarity with the brave people of Ukraine. **Central Branch**

QPs in solidarity with the people of Ukraine were rung at St Mary le Wigford and at Potterhanworth. 2 QPs were rung at Potterhanworth to thank the Keltek Trust for their work, tower donations were sent to the Trust funds. It was a 1st in m for all. Well done to Howard Pell who rang the treble to PB Doubles at Ewerby, it was his first QP away from Cover. Further QPs were rung at Sleaford, at Eagle (by the RAF Guild for their AGM weekend) and at Potterhanworth (their annual Culfrey QP) **Eastern Branch**

The bells were rung at Sibsey on March 19th for the Memorial service for Derek Smith, tower captain at Sibsey for many years. The ringers were Tom Freeston, Yvonne Smith, David Bennett, Mick Smith, David Collin and Colin Simpson, treble to tenor. Tony Barker checked the bells prior to the service and David Bennett did a clean up job in the ringing chamber as the bells had been silent for many months. One of Derek's sons thanked the ringers personally and was very moved that the bells were rung for his father's service. A QP of 4 Delight methods was rung at Wigtoft in solidarity with the people of Ukraine.
