Commonwealth Day: this was marked with general ringing at Coningsby, Immingham, Lincoln Cathedral, Lincoln St Mary le W, Old Bolingbroke, Belton in Axholme, Ruskington and Spalding.

Southern Branch the meeting at Corby Glen attracted 47 members to the church and 37 stayed for lunch in the Woodhouse Arms. It was fantastic to see so many there with 5 new members elected and 3 further application forms taken. Hard work for the two ringing masters who did an excellent job in giving everyone a chance to ring, from Rounds & Call Changes to London Surprise Minor. At Sproxton a new method Great Hale Delight was Alan Bird's 400th peal. Quaking Houses Surprise was rung in memory of Harry Poyner, a one time member of the Weds peal band at Sproxton. A further new method was rung – Blyth Delight. On Mothering Sunday Gavin Simpson rang his 1st QP of TB in a QP at West Deeping.

West Lindsey Branch: The branch practice at Kirton Lindsey was very well attended – probably the best for quite a few years. Ringing from rounds to Cambridge and Stedman was enjoyed and our newest members acquitted themselves well.
