LINCOLN DIOCESAN GUILD NEWSSHEET AND DIARY, JUNE 2023

The Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla
contained in the Ringing World Coronation Supplement – I am aware that further unpublished ringing has taken
place so apologies to anyone inadvertently missed out. Many congratulations to everyone on a magnificent effort
and in particular welcome to all the new ringers, (some are named, sorry to those whose names I don't know)
and hope that you will have a great time as you continue your ringing journey. Many thanks to all their teachers.
5 peals were rung – At Silk Willoughby Mia Bradford (young ringer) rand her 1st peal – the treble to 7 minor methods. At
Stow Chris Potts rang his 1st peal – Tenor to Grandsire Triples. Many congratulations to them, first of many we hope.
The peal at Stow was a 1st in method for Alyson Blanchard, Graham Colborne circled the tower. A peal of Cambridge
minor was rung at Market Deeping and one of 7 minor methods was rung at Potterhanworth. This latter one was also a
wedding compliment to Tom Blyth and Tracey Hall and to welcome Keith Butter as new Guild RM. A coronation handbell
peal was also rung for local ringing royalty Les Townsend's 90th birthday (see below)

31 QPs were rung in Lincolnshire. At Ewerby Tom White rang his 1st on 8 bells. At Grimsby the QP of St Simon's was a 1st for all the band. At Legbourne the QP of Doubles was also an 82nd birthday compliment to local ringer Keith Faulkner. At Silk Willoughby Julie Coney rang her 1st QP – treble to PBD. At St Mary le Wigford a new method Opehlia was rung. 3 1/8 peals were recorded. John Underwood and Mick Stracey rang a 720 at Thorpe on the Hill which meant that they had both rung at the Coronation of QE2 and KC3
