RINGING for EVENSONG Lincoln Cathedral (12, 23-3-13) Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> April Meet at 2:15pm PROMPT

**Special method: Little Penultimus Little Place Cinques (E.1.E.1.E.1.E.1.E.10E-1)** 

Treble plain hunts up to 10ths place. Inside bells plain hunt up to 11ths except when the treble is underneath in 10ths place, in which case they make long 11ths. No dodging is involved. This is a good exercise for listening for the treble.

Special method: Kent Treble Bob Major (3 leads) (34x34.18x12x18x12x18x12x18x12x18-14)

### Sat 30<sup>th</sup> April Guild AGM

Many ringers from all over the Guild descended on Lincoln for the Guild AGM, and support from our branch came from Barton and Grimsby ringers. Your Ringing Master, a member of the Ancient Society of College Youths, managed to get lost while calling a touch of Grandsire Cinques, which was rather embarrassing. After the ringing the business meeting took place at Bailgate Methodist Church near Newport Arch, where Les Townsend stood down as Guild Secretary after an amazing nineteen years, and the new one was announced as Sandra Underwood. Emma Southerington stood down as Peal Secretary after five years, and Jim Benner was the new replacement. Judith Rogers wished to congratulate those who rang the first towerbell peal of Norman Smith's 23-spliced Surprise Major for the Guild, a difficult peal in which Matthew Jeffery was involved. This was followed by a buffet tea in the adjacent hall. Ringing then took place up the Cathedral tower for Evensong. It was a shame that the Open University choir, who sang at the service, were not as good as the Cathedral choir. There was also ringing at the nearby tower of Washingborough, where the ringers had tea and the raffle was drawn.

## Mon 25<sup>th</sup> April Lincoln

St. Mary's Choir, Barton was invited by the Bishop of Lincoln to sing Choral Evensong at Lincoln Cathedral on Easter Monday, in recognition of Rev. Alan Wright's great achievement of 40 years as choirmaster. Barton also provided a team of ringers for this event. This was arranged by Roger Lord, Tower Captain, to compliment Rev. Alan Wright for his great achievement with St. Mary's choir. Roger was invited by Les Townsend, the Master of the Cathedral to be in charge of the ringing. Both the choir and the ringers were complimented on their excellent performances.

### Sat 14<sup>th</sup> May Walesby

Branch members mainly from Market Rasen, Tealby, Claxby and Grimsby attended this event. It turned out to be a nice piece of informal ringing for the annual Open Churches event. The bells at Walesby are notorious for being difficult to ring but, in general, they were handled quite well.

### **Guild committee meeting**

At the May Guild Committee meeting the committee looked at the insurance policy and will get quotes for higher levels of accident cover. Also the question was asked if people still be covered by the insurance policy prior to them paying their subs for the year. As subs become due from 1<sup>st</sup> January every year, it is important that members pay promptly to avoid any confusion. Honorary life members are covered by the policy. Non-resident ringers are not. New Gift Aid forms have been drawn up, so in the near future you may be asked to fill out a new form.

The ITTS (Integrated Teacher Training Scheme) course, run by Sue Faull, which trains ringing teachers, has so far been a success, and more courses will be run in the future. Members should take the opportunity to join these courses.

It has been suggested that we have the two young ringers' Lincoln Guild teams that took part in the RW National Youth Striking Competition in March should be invited to take part in the Guild 8-bell Striking Competition in 2012.

Also the Guild Master had asked that members begin to think about what type of ringing they wish to do for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012.

# **Branch Committee Meeting**

# Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> July Huddersfield area tour


